THE JEWS OF CUBA A MARRIAGE OF CULTURES FEBRUARY 18-24, 2025, DECEMBER 3-9, 2025

The Jewish history of Cuba traces back to the island's first European settler, converso Luis de Torres (Yosef ben Levy Ha-Ivri), who served as a translator for Christopher Columbus. While the majority of Cuba's Jewish population emigrated after Castro's revolution in 1959, today's small but vibrant community is eager to share its stories, culture, and foods. 
